Yangtze River Express to Open New Air Cargo Route from Dec. 2

Yangtze River Express Airlines Co. Ltd., a cargo airline majority-owned by HNA Group, will launch Shanghai-Novosibirsk-Luxembourg-Hahn-Beijing cargo route, starting from Dec. 2, to improve its freight network and meet the increasing international cargo transportation demand.

The thrice-weekly cargo service will be operated by Boeing 747 aircraft. Every Wednesday, Friday and Sunday, the cargo plane will take off from Shanghai Pudong International Airport.

Frankfurt-Hahn Airport(HNN), one of the fastest growing airport of Germany, is situated in a superior geographical position, which is not only close to the German economic center - Frankfurt, but also has a convenient transportation network across France, the Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg and other West European countries and regions.

With a powerful fleet and strong capacity in routes operation, Yangtze River Express has been developing new air cargo routes constantly despite the downturn in cargo market both at home and abroad. Furthermore, it provides customers with more convenient and efficient services with its improved international cargo network, which is "centered in Shanghai, covering Asia and expanding to Europe and America".

As of Nov. 2012, Yangtze River Express operates a fleet of 17 all-cargo freighters, including 13 Boeing 737-300 all-cargo aircraft, three B747-400 all-cargo aircraft and one Airbus A330-200 freighter.
